The land east of Eden, where Cain went; Hebrew word for "wandering" (See Genesis 4:1-16)

### **Perpetuate**

To continue indefinitely

### **Purchased**

To have bought something

### **Self-Sufficient**

Able to take care of oneself

### **Stewardship**

Act of appropriately utilizing that which God has given.

### **Unleavened**

Not to rise; typically associated with the kind of bread without yeast the Israelites were told to make when they fled Egypt.

### **Victoriously**

Successful in a war or battle

### **War**

A military conflict between two or more parties

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
