Feast

Mourning

Expressing grief; Weeping

Passover

A Jewish feast that commemorates the passing over of the angel of death in Egypt against the firstborns as the last plague against the Pharaoh before he released them.

Purchase

To take possession of through the exchange of money

Rebuilt

To remake

Sleep

To be inactive and dormant
